

Home Safety Check Schemes


- First NI pilot scheme began in 1989 - funded by Belfast City Council
- Other stand-alone schemes across
 NI last 10 yrs
- Mainly through Environmental Health Services
- Various funders council, Investing for Health, Big Lottery Fund
- SureStarts, Health Visitors, Community Workers – variation in extent of Home Safety Work



Home Safety Check Schemes (continued)

1 12

- Target over 65s and under 5s
- Mainly on request from householder (over 65's) and Health Visitor/Social Worker (under 5's)
- · Raise awareness of Home Safety
- Provide safety equipment
- Make referrals to Occupational Therapists, Environmental Health Officers, Health Visitors and Landlords
- Refer for 10 year smoke alarm to NIFRS












- Agreement on proforma (checklist) for Older Person's visit (over 65's)






Problems, problems and more problems!


- Linking summary forms to main form

- Detail recorded






Example of statistics from pilot:

- 628 reports
- Number of Adults



- Number of Assessments






Objective 4: Provide statistical reports (continued)

- 207 had a home accident in last year (34%)
- 104 visited GP
- 85 visited hospital
- Over half used more than 4 different types of medication per day



• 22% had obstructed staircases




Objective 4: Provide statistical reports (continued)

- Over 26% did not have chimney swept regularly
- 10% did not have boiler serviced annually
- 11% did not have a smoke detector



 21% had a smoke detector that wasn't working properly





Objective 5: Inform on future projects

Statistics from pilot:

- 76% older people did not keep a light on at night
- 39% of older people did not turn a light on when getting up at night

Outcome:

Equipment provision – low energy light bulbs and touch lamps a priority.
