

NEBOSH Award in Workplace Health and Safety

► Course objectives

- A basic understanding of health and safety principles and practices in the workplace

- Sources of health and safety information
- Health and safety roles and responsibilities
- Systems for managing health and safety
- How incidents are caused and improving performance
- Risk assessment and identifying control measures
- Topic-specific hazards and controls
- Welfare and environmental issues
- Assessment phase

Qualification

Students are assessed by a multiple choice examination and a practical risk assessment which tests their ability to put into practice the knowledge gained during the course.
