

# NEBOSH International General Certificate

## ► Course objectives

The course aims to provide an understanding of health and safety principles and practices, to enable delegates to monitor safety performance in their workplace, investigate accidents effectively and assist in the design and implementation of safe systems of work and accident prevention programmes.

On completion of the course, delegates should:

- Gain an appreciation of hazards associated with typical workplace activities, enabling them to fulfil their occupational health and safety responsibilities
- Be able to assist management of safety within the workplace

The course aims to provide an opportunity for multi-national delegates to gain a common understanding of health and safety management techniques.

## ► Who should attend?

Managers, supervisors and employees based outside the UK who require a broad knowledge and understanding of health and safety principles and practices. It is also suitable for those embarking on a career in health and safety, providing a sound basis for progression on to the NEBOSH International Diploma.

## ► Further information

No previous health and safety knowledge is required, but it should be noted that the examination is offered and must be answered in English and that the course includes a requirement to write a short report, which must also be in English. NEBOSH recommends that candidates should reach the equivalent of a scoring of 6.0 or higher under the International English Language Testing System (IELTS).
