
Where We Are and Where We Are Going

The New Context

- The Christie Commission recommendations: outcome focus; localisation; integration; co-production; transparency and accountability
- Renewing Scotland: economic recovery and regeneration, and the 'four pillars': prevention; place; people and performance: review of community planning
- The Spending Review: 12% real reduction; prioritisation of investment; shift towards prevention (change and transformation funds)
- The income and demand squeeze: the need to target and reduce failure demand



What Happens if Nothing Changes?



Christie: Reform Should:

- Support achievement of outcomes
- Be affordable and sustainable within existing budgets
- Strengthen accountability through democratically elected reps
- Build services around people and communities needs
- Empower front line staff
- Support the local integration of service provision
- Encourage prevention; tackle inequalities; promote equality
- Improve transparency over plans; spending; performance
- Streamline public sector landscape
- Consistent with and support <u>wider</u> public sector reform and improvement



Challenges

- Variation between top 20% and bottom 20% wider than European comparators
- Variation within councils greater than variation within them
- High clustering at community (small area) level
- Both negative and positive life outcomes cluster
- Negative outcomes drive public spending (unemployment; drug and alcohol addiction; educational failure; poor health)



Opportunities

- Work together in partnership you can't do it on your own
- We need to forget where we have been no option but to do things differently
- Don't hang around waiting for someone else to change things - lead change and make it work
- Safety and resilient are integral to better outcomes across the range
- Arrive at conclusions, don't start with them
