






European age standardised admission rates (EASR) per 100,000 for unintentional injuries; children under 15 years, 31 March 2015 to 2024




European age standardised admission rates (EASR) per 100,000 for road traffic injuries; children under 15 years, 31 March 2015 to 2024




Emergency hospital admissions as a result of an unintentional injury; children under 15 years, year ending 31 March 2024



Emergency hospital admissions as a result of an unintentional injury; main diagnoses, children under 15 years, year ending 31 March 2024




Emergency hospital admissions as a result of a dog bite/strike; children under 17 years, 31 March 1998 to 2024







Emergency hospital admissions by injury location; All unintentional injuries, in children under 15 years, year ending 31 March 2024
